We had 5 students apply for an Enrichment Scholarship asking assistance to attend an Enrichment Camp this past summer in Hastings. The cost of the camp was \$550 per student. We awarded one student \$100, due to receiving another scholarship through Hastings and the other four students each received \$175 from the RCHS Foundation Summer Enrichment Fund to assist in the cost of camp. We really wanted to award each student more, but our Enrichment fund balance was limited. We are asking for your kindness in helping us to replenish the Enrichment fund so that we may continue to help send students to these camps each year. We feel it is an excellent opportunity for our youth. Each of the students that went were asked to write a brief paragraph about the camp.

The Scholars camp was very enjoyable, I honestly wish it lasted longer. It was a great learning experience and I learned things I never knew. I was also able to make new friends. The first day was a little nerve wracking because at the assembly they said we would be taking college level classes. However the classes were much easier than you would think. I took the Science portion of the camp. It was broken into two parts, Genetics and Nutrition. In the nutrition portion we learned mostly about Genetic modification, and the truths and lies about it. How people fear GMOs but truthfully GMOs are harmless. In the Genetics portion we learned about genetic traits, DNA replication, and the production of proteins. There also weren't any tests or quizzes so you didn't have to worry. I had so much fun I didn't even notice I was in class for 6 hours a day. The courses they offered were nutrition, genetics, robotics, and history. I took the science portion of the classes which were nutrition and genetics. In genetics we learned about the structure of DNA and made models to help us better understand the structure and some of the processes of copying DNA. We worked with a substance called PTC. A substance that some people can taste and some people cannot. We were able to taste the substance then use our DNA to figure out our genotype. I was a genotype that could taste the bitterness of the substance. We also isolated our DNA and went through a process to make it visible and then put it in a necklace. In nutrition we took many field trips. We visited Prairie Loft and learned about decomposers and their importance to the food chain. We also went to Weeks Family Farms and learned about organic farming and why he decided to switch to that type of farming. He also talked about some of the challenges he has faced making the switch. We also took a trip to the U.S Meat Animal Research Center. We learned about some of the research and experiments they are conducting there. We also took time to learn about GMOs and some of the instances where they have already been used. Other than this we got the chance to make a lot of new friends and participate in many fun activities. The Hastings College Scholars Academy was a great experience and I hope to go again next year. *-Brooklyn Buell*

The Hastings College Scholars Academy is for students in grades 6-8. We were able to choose from science, robotics or Russian history. I chose Robotics. In this class, we used LEGO MINDSTORM kits to build a robot. We programmed our robot to do tasks assigned by our professors. We coded the robot to move forward and backward and eventually making the robot move along colored tape. We even coded a robot that had to be fed LEGO bricks in order to survive. We also created circuits with an Arduino that could use our own muscle to move the arm of our partner. We made scribble robots and rockets, too. My professors were engineering grad students and a robotics teacher from Papillion. We got to live in the dorms like college kids, meet some amazing new friends, and do fun activities like the water park, an escape room, and a scavenger hunt as well as social groups. ### **Rock County High School Foundation Purpose**

The Rock County High School Foundation, Inc. is a non-profit, tax-exempt organization, which was incorporated in December of 1986 for the purpose of establishing a vehicle for contributions that would provide new and improved educational opportunities for the benefit of students, teachers, and residents of District 100, Rock County.

Proposed projects for the foundation include, but are not limited to: funding for academic or enrichment scholarships, special projects such as student exchanges, projects which are designed to improve instruction or curriculum and recognition of special accomplishments of staff or students.

Contributions can be made to the foundation as outright contributions -- contributions to the general fund, existing funds, or newly designated funds; recognition gifts -- cash gifts to honor a special occasion or person; deferred gifts -- bequests, trusts or life insurance; or memorial gifts -- money donated to honor a deceased friend or relative.

At the present time, a \$100.00 contribution can be designated for a specific one-year purpose. A \$2,500.00 contribution will perpetuate a \$100.00 scholarship. Contributions of less than \$100.00 can be made to the general fund or applied to any existing fund and contributions of any amount can be designated for any Rock County student through an Adopt-a-Student certificate.

#### **Academic Scholarships**

Over seventy academic scholarships totaling over \$28,000.00 were offered through the selection process to the graduating class of 2018.

#### **Enrichment Grants**

Six grants totaling \$900.00 are available to be used by individuals or groups for activities which are culturally or educationally enriching for students. The Paul H. and Jennie Engler FFA Enrichment Scholarship provides funds to FFA members for extracurricular enrichment activities.

#### **Adopt-a-Student Certificates**

The Adopt-a-Student fund provides an opportunity for every Rock County student to have a scholarship account and allows donors to contribute to scholarship funds for students of their choice. Programs are currently in place to provide scholarship certificates for drawings at the annual Post Prom event, and recognize honor roll students, scholastic letter winners and FFA state farmer recipients.
